

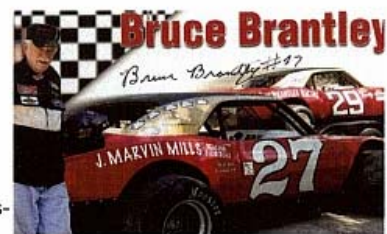
Bruce Brantley

Brantley, who now lives in Lawrenceville, Georgia, started driving in the early 60s, and probably won around 200 races. He raced mostly in the Atlanta area until the mid'60s, when he began running events on the NASCAR late model sportsman tour. Today, he's highly involved in vintage racing. A replica of the 1955 Chevy he built and raced is in the International Motorsports Hall of Fame in Talladega, AL.



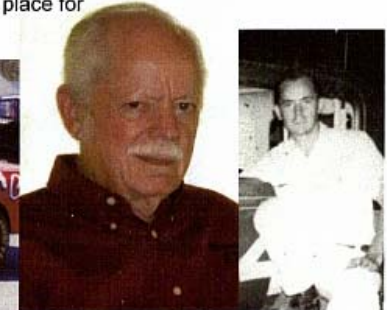
- *1956-1972-Independent driver, car owner and mechanic
